
# **TROJAN HALL OF FAME 2016 INDUCTEES**




#### **Dave Britton**

Mr. Britton was hired in August of 1973 to teach math and coach football and baseball. In 1974, he designed, taught, and administered a State recognized drop-out prevention program called Basic Academic Social Education (widely known as BASE). Dave was named Assistant Principal in 1976. Under his leadership, Fife was one of the first districts to use personal computers to manage student records. He introduced computer labs to all the schools and directed their development for over 20 years. As a member of the Kiwanis, Mr. Britton advised the Key Club for over 20 years.



## Linnea (Bisig) Maulding

Linnea graduated from Fife High in 1967. While at Fife, Linnea played tennis and was a member of the Torch Club each of her 3 years. She was editor of the yearbook as a senior.
