
TROJAN HALL OF FAME 2014 INDUCTEES



Steve Slavens

In the fall of 1974, Steve came to Fife High School, where he started out his teaching and coaching career. As head track coach for 16 years, the boys finished no lower than 3rd in league, earning 3 league and district titles. His teams placed in the State's top 10 seven times and was State Champion in 1985. Steve was named track coach of the year 3 times as well. As a volunteer head coach of the FHS Powerlifting team, many of his student-athletes have set state and national records. The FHS Powerlifting Team has been State Champion across all classifications 4 times and Steve was named Powerlifting Coach of the Year twice. After 40 years of service to the Fife School District, Steve retired from teaching in June, 2014.



Pat Reed

Pat started working in the Fife School District in 1985. During her nearly 30 year stint, she spearheaded a love of reading in hundreds of students. She was one of the first staff members to recognize the impact young-adult literature had on middle school, junior, and senior high school students. Additionally, Pat has tirelessly collected stories, photographs, and information on significant events in Fife High School's history. Leonard Sanderson

He served on the Fife School Board as well as the Milton Planning Commission from 1965-1975, he served on Milton's City Council for 20 years (9½ as mayor). Among many other activities, Leonard is on the Milton/Edgewood Library Board, the Lions Club board, and a reader at Discovery Elementary.



Frank Dacca

Frank graduated in the Class of 1965. Born and raised in Fife, Frank helped on the family farm, located where Columbia Junior High is today. Frank was very active in school athletics and extracurricular committees and projects. Frank went on to the University of Washington and then to UC Davis earning his law degree in 1973. Frank is very proud of his family heritage and the community in which he was raised – returning to Fife in 1980 to operate a law office until 2003. Frank served as Milton's judge from 1989 – 1993 and has been serving the citizens as a District Court Judge since 2003. Frank's true passion is his commitment to the Fife community where he serves on the board for both Camp Harmony and the Fife Historical Society.
